




Water bottles

It is really important to stay hydrated at school! There are water fountains available (although they are out of action presently due to safety restrictions), but the best way to have water in school is to bring in a clearly labelled water bottle which will be kept near the children in the classrooms.

Swimming (the pool is currently closed due to COVID but we will notify you as soon as we are able to swim again).

The year 2 swimming day is normally Tuesday. We currently swim two out of the three terms in short blocks of 5 or 6 weekly lessons. You will receive an email in advance to let you know the specific dates of lessons (one class will swim for one half term, and then we will swap). Please make sure that children have full swimming kit, including a swimming hat and do not have any jewellry in/on. Children without kit or with jewellry that they can't remove themselves will not be able to swim that week.





A sample year 2 timetable for a week. This may change slightly if necessary.







- We will read with children at school as much as we are able to either one to one with an adult or in group reading sessions. Reading also plays a big part of all of our lessons and we will do whole class reading activities.
- Children's books will be changed weekly and they will be given sufficient books to last them the week (the number of books will depend on their progress in reading, the amount of reading they are doing at home and the length of the books).




Homework

My choice and grammar are sent home on Fridays alternating weeks - one week my choice, one week grammar - and you get two weekends to complete the homework.

Homework is collected in on the 2nd

Monday after it is given out.



Spellings will be sent out Weekly and will start after October half term.



We have three different homework books in year 2:

- <u>My choice</u> is based on our topic work and has a small selection of activities to choose from. Please make sure your child does at least one of the activities (but you don't have to do them all unless you want to!!).
- <u>Grammar/Phonics</u> covers our grammar curriculum through the year and is also occasionally topped up with any phonics that we feel the children need.
- <u>Maths</u> this is new for this year and will follow through our maths curriculum. We will give more details when we are ready to.



Parent involvement

- Read as much as you can with your child and ask questions about what they are reading.
- Practise spellings.
- Help your child with their homework.
- Visit the library
