
Why is there a Phonics Screening Check in Year 1?

- Started in 2012
- Takes place every June
- Aims to ensure that all children are taught to read before leaving primary school

What happens in the Phonics Screening Check?

Your child will have to:

- Read 40 words
 - 20 of the words are real
 - 20 are not real
- The words get progressively more difficult
- The words will check phonic reading skills from phases 2-5
 - Jolly phonics pure sounds



How will it be administered?

- One child at a time
- In the quiet room
- All in one go
- Practise with support
- Reading 40 words on their own
 - 1 Phonics check training video

What does my child need to know to pass?

Phase 2 - single letter sounds

Phase 3 - digraphs and trigraphs

Phase 4 - more complex combinations of sounds

Phase 5 - alternate sounds

Blending, not guessing!
