English activities:

With our focus on **Jack and the Beanstalk** we would then be writing a set of instruction on how to grow/care for our own bean plants. However, we understand this might be a little tricky at home, so we will give you a choice of topics to choose from.

The following will give you some lesson ideas.

WALT use a verb in a sentence

Now can you use a verb in a sentence? You can use the verbs from the lesson above or you can use your own verbs.

Here's some examples of what you could write:

(verb: jump)

The excited boy jumped up and down with joy because it was his birthday.

One sunny day the dog jumped over the fence.

I really enjoy jumping on my trampoline.

Write one sentence for each verb you choose. Can you write a least 5 sentences? If you are feeling up for a challenge why not try 10 sentences.

Top Tips to remember:

- Capital letters
- Letters formed correctly
- Use a verb
- Full stop
- Challenge: use a connective like and, because, but, so

WALT explore instructions

Instructions use verbs too and we call these bossy verbs (or imperative verbs). Bossy verbs are a little bossy and tell us what to do, for example spread the butter, add the cheese, cut the sandwich, eat the sandwich.

Have a go at following some instructions (see addition instruction documents). See if you can stop the bossy verbs as you go and have fun.

WALT create your own set of instructions

Instruction writing is really easy to do! All you need to do is be bossy and clear in your instructions. **Now you will need to have a go and write your own instructions.** Here's a set of instructions to help you writing your instructions!

1. Give it a title. What are you making or doing?
2. List what you will need.
3. Start at the beginning and use numbers to show the order.
4. Use bossy verbs in your sentences.
5. Make sure you include all the steps.
6. Challenge: include diagrams to show each step.

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
