Strategies to learn your spellings:

Rainbow writing:

Write over the word repeatedly in the colours of the rainbow so the children learn the pattern.

Look at the spelling pattern:

Walk - add ed to change it into the past tense.

Skip - double the consonant (p) if the letter before is a short sounding vowel (i) and then add ed... skipped

Dictionary work:

Use a dictionary to find other examples that follow the same spelling pattern. Find the definition of unknown words.


What kind of words are they (adjective, verb, adverb)

Do you know this story? Can you read it or watch it online? Can you act it out with people who live with you in your house?

Describing characters

Talk to someone about your answers to these questions:

Who can you see in the pictures?

How do they look?

How do they behave?

Could you add your own character to the story? What job would they have in the story? E.g. a fairy godmother that makes the wolf disappear!

Look at one of the characters and write down nouns (the names of the things you can see - e.g. cloak, hair, basket).

Adjectives

Now add an adjective or two to each noun to make <u>noun phrases</u> (e.g. brown curly hair, heavy and full basket, nasty grey wolf).

Sentences

Try to use your noun phrases from the activity above into sentences with interesting sentences openers..

e.g. Suddenly a nasty grey wolf jumped out of a dark gloomy forest with a smirk on his face.

Now combine to create a WANTED poster (character description):

Write a description using the above sentences you have created. You could make a wanted poster for the wolf! You could start like this...

WANTED MR WOLF!

Have you seen a grey sneaky wolf that goes by the name of Fred? Don't forget to include:

- a picture
- his behaviour
- where he lives
- his age
- his appearance (what he looks like)
- why is he wanted?
