Activity 1
<u>Activity 1</u> Look at the flipcharts for the lessons building up to writing a diary entry. There are a few tasks on the flipcharts for you to complete. Activity 2

Remember the key features of a diary entry. A diary entry is a form
of recount in which the writer explains what has happened to them. At school we
wrote a diary entry when we were reading the Vanishing Forest. As a reminder, here's a checklist of the key features to use when you write a diary entry.
• Start with 'Dear Diary'.

- **Describe** the places where the events happened.
- Write in the **past tense**.
- Use **pronouns** like I, my and me to show that the events happened to you.
- Talk about how you were **feeling** or what you were **thinking** when each event happened.
- Use interesting vocabulary.
