Strategies to learn your spellings:

It is your turn to retell the story! Remember: • What happens at the beginning? • What happens in the middle? • What happens at the end?	
Use your work from previous weeks to help you retell the story. When you retell the story make sure you are including everything on the success criteria, go back and check by ticking this list:	
Success Criteria: - Include adjectives to describe a setting and character (e.g. huge, floppy tongue). - Include prepositions (e.g. In front of, behind, next to).	

- Include exciting verbs (e.g. Stumbled, dashed, glared).
- Write in the past tense (e.g. He <u>swam</u>, he jumped).
- Include conjunctions to add more detail (e.g. And, because, so).
- Include time conjunctions to order (e.g. First, then, finally).
- Include speech (e.g. "Who are you?" exclaimed the boy).
- Include adverbs (e.g. Nervously, slowly, excitedly)

Use a thesaurus to find better words if you can!

Extension: can you edit and improve your work? Rewrite your improved story in your neatest handwriting, including all of your changes.

## Grammar:

Sentence writing and punctuation.

- All sentences need a **capital letter** at the beginning and a **punctuation mark** at the end, like a full stop (.), a question mark (?) or an exclamation mark (!).
- All sentences need to include a **subject** (who or what) and a **verb** (a doing word).
- Sentences must make complete sense all on their own.
