# Rocking Romans

Last week we looked at Boudicca, who she was and her battle with the Romans. This week we are going to sequence events using a comic strip. We have used comic strips for sequencing lots of times in Year 3 - so you should all be experts at this!

## Boudicca Comic Strip

Use the information sheet we have sent to help you sequence the events for your comic strip. Draw a picture for each significant event and write a short description of what is happening below the picture. Think about how you can use time connectives (afterwards, next, then etc.) to write your comic strip.

LO: to be able to identify the main event in a story.

Try and add as much detail as possible in your pictures and use coloured pencils or pens to make them stand out!

#### Roman Mosaics

Roman mosaics are designs made from tiny coloured stones and broken pottery called tessera. Different materials such as marble and coloured glass were sometimes used. Roman mosaics often decorated public and private buildings. The Roman craftsmen used different coloured tesserae the way you use crayons and pens to create colourful pictures. They glued them down and filled in the cracks using mortar, which is like a thin cement mixture.
