<u>My Notes</u>
Tectonic plates and earthquakes
The plates move;
<ul> <li>Into each other (slowly, mountains)</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Against each other (quickly, earthquakes)</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Away from each other (slowly, volcanos)</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>One goes downwards, other pushes upwards.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>These cause mountains, volcanos and earthquakes.</li> </ul>

Full sentences for my report

### Tectonic plates and earthquakes

- The movement of the tectonic plates can create mountains, earthquakes and volcanoes.
- One plate will go downwards whilst the other one pushes upwards.
- When the tectonic plates move into each other slowly a mountain is created.
- If the tectonic plates move against each other very quickly then there can be an earthquake.
- Finally, when the plates push against each other this can cause a volcano.
