The Nine Dot Puzzle

Use a pencil to draw four continuous straight line segments which go through the middle of all 9 dots without taking the pencil off the paper.

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HINT: Think outside the box – this puzzle was invented in 1914 and is thought to have invented the phrase "thinking outside the box"!

Hint 2 on the next side.

HINT 2: Or think outside the grid, it doesn't say anything about how long the lines should be.
